

Key achievements to date until July 2020:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<p>As a school we focused on offering physical activities and encouraged healthy active lifestyles. We employed an additional midday supervisor to encourage happy active playtimes with a variety of sporting equipment on offer.</p> <p>We enlisted the services of a music and voice coach for a healthy lungs scheme and focused on ensuring our existing equipment was kept up to safety standards and new equipment purchased to replace old and damaged items.</p> <p>School clubs including running and dance as well as pupils being involved in sports programmes to compete against other schools was a well-supported activity which due to Covid 19 restriction had to be stopped.</p>	<p>Covid19 has placed a lot of restrictions on the children being in school to take part in the activities that were planned prior to the lockdown. Our focus was shifted to preparing for the return of children and what activities could be done without cross social bubbles.</p> <p>Since the easing of some restrictions the school clubs have started again and the children have been able to participate in a sports day.</p>
